1. Select License Terms to display
2. Customise Permissions menus
3. Decide on set values to populate the Note fields
4. Create a template from which all licenses are duplicated

- Set-up menu options
- Select License Terms
- Whether to use legal jargon or lay terms
- Clarity of expression
- Interpretation of license statements
- Resolving which agreement applies
- No reporting tool in SerialsSolutions yet
