Western Open Books (it's not just textbooks)

- Employs sustainable service design: open textbook hosting, copyright advice, design support, production and publications support and coordinated peer review, promotions and metrics

WHAT ARE OPEN TEXTBOOKS?

Open textbooks are written and reviewed by university staff in most disciplines globally and are offered freely in digital form.

Open texts can benefit students and staff by supporting enhanced engagement, participation rates, and retention whilst presenting opportunities for transformative assessment practices linked to professional and industry outcomes. These openly-licensed texts make it easier to permit reuse and revision legally.

Western Open Books are also published in the Pressbooks Directory.


LIBRARY PUBLISHING SUPPORT



Accessibility improvements




- Western Open Books provides free worldwide access to its content

- → DOI minting using DataCite
- → 'Sandpit' guide for user testing
