# Path to Open Value Statement

Path to Open is building a roadmap to open access for scholarly books. Shaped through discussions with book publishers, library leaders, and scholars, this new community-supported program will provide libraries with affordable access to diverse, high-quality frontlist book titles, support sustainable university press publishing in the humanities and social sciences, help authors reach a global audience, and advance equity of access to underserved researchers and readers around the world.

# How Path to Open works

monographs

university presses contributing frontlist in 2023

first 100 titles were published

titles published over the course of the pilot, 300 frontlist titles per year from

2024-2026

100 1,000 3-year

embargo, with books becoming open each January, from 2026

# The Path to Open pilot timeline

August 2023

Spring 2024 title lists confirmed

2024-2026

Publish 300 titles annually

#### January 2023

Launch the Path to Open pilot program

#### May 2023

Complete title list for titles to be published in the program

#### October 2023

Launch 100 titles after 30 university presses and 150 libraries commit to participate

#### January 2026

2023 Path to Open books become open access


