

ASS PROF OFER MINTZ

Business School, UTS

Dr. Ofer Mintz is Associate Head (External Engagement) of the Marketing Department and an Associate Professor in Marketing at the University of Technology Sydney (UTS). His research focuses on marketing strategy/analytics, digital marketing, the role of marketing in startups, and firm and marketing strategies during the COVID-19 era. Ofer has presented invited research talks on five continents, been awarded grants from several academic-practitioner organizations, and published research in leading academic journals, such as the Journal of Marketing, Marketing Science, Journal of International Business Studies and International Journal of Research in Marketing, and in leading managerial outlets, such as the World Economic Forum, Forbes, Mumbrella, and Harvard Business School Working Knowledge.

Ofer is the first Australian-based scholar to have his research win the Buzzell Award "greatest impact on marketing thought and practice" over the past two years by the Marketing Science Institute (in 2021), which was awarded for research w/Tim Gilbride, Imran Currim, and Peter Lenk identifying the right metric(s) for the right marketing-mix decision. In addition, Ofer, along with his co-authors, was nominated as a finalist for the Buzzell Award by the Marketing Science Institute in 2019 for research examining drivers of metric use for marketing decisions in 16 countries.



DANIELLE COOPER

Director, Libraries, Scholarly Communication & Museums, Ithaka S+R

Danielle Cooper is the director for libraries, scholarly communication, and museums at Ithaka S+R, where she oversees a team exploring how information practices are evolving in higher education and cultural organizations. Her team specializes in creating large-scale cohortbased projects and working with underrepresented and under-resourced academic communities, including Indigenous Studies scholars, community colleges, and currently incarcerated learners. She is a passionate applied researcher and has trained hundreds of librarians to collaborate on Ithaka S+R projects.

Prior to joining Ithaka S+R Danielle worked as a librarian at Ryerson University and George Brown College while pursuing her doctoral studies at York University. Her dissertation is entitled "Personal Touches, Public Legacies: An Ethnography of Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender Libraries and Archives."

Deputy Vice-Chancellor Equity, Diversity and Inclusion, UNSW

Eileen Baldry (BA, DipEd, MWP, PhD) is a Professor of Criminology at UNSW where she has been an academic since 1993. Eileen has held a number of senior positions in the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences and served as Interim Dean (mid-2015 to 2016), Associate Dean Education (ADE) (2007 to mid-2010) and Deputy Dean (mid-2010 to mid-2015). She has taught social policy, social development and criminology over the past two decades.

In 2016 Eileen was named as one of the inaugural PLuS Alliance Fellows in Social Justice. She also holds the distinguished position of Academic Chair, UNSW Equity, Diversity and Inclusion Board and is the current Deputy Chair of the Disability Council NSW. Eileen's research and publications focus on social justice matters and include mental health and cognitive disability in the criminal justice system; education, training and employment for prisoners and ex-prisoners; homelessness and transition from prison; Indigenous social work; community development and social housing; and disability services. She has been and is a Chief investigator on a number of major Australian Research Council (ARC), NH&MRC, Housing and Criminology grants over the past 20 years. She is involved in a voluntary capacity with a number of development and justice community agencies including being a Director on the Board of the Public Interest Advocacy Centre (PIAC). In 2009, the Law and Justice Foundation of NSW recognised Eileen's "indefatigable" support for justice-related causes by awarding her its highest honour: the Justice Medal. She was made an Officer of the Order of Australia (AO) in 2021.





PROF JENNIFER BARRETT

Pro Vice-Chancellor Indigenous (Academic), University of Sydney

Associate Professor Jennifer Barrett publishes on museums, culture, art, and the public sphere. Her monograph, Museums and the Public Sphere, was published in 2011 (Wiley-Blackwell) and her co-authored monograph Australian Artists in the Contemporary Museum (with J. Millner, Ashgate Publishing) was published in 2014. Her current research examines the concept of universalism as it relates to museums, cultural practice and human rights.

Professor Barrett's research profile and professional external engagements over the past three decades within the cultural sector reflects her deep commitment to the knowledges, beliefs, arts, laws and customs of Indigenous communities in Australia. Professor Barrett's motivation to apply for the role was informed by her commitment to the work of the Indigenous Strategy and Services portfolio, her strong support of its values and her demonstrated capacity to lead the work for which this role is responsible. Professor Barrett well understands the interconnected nature of this role within the University and how it functions across disciplines and links with external partners, existing and potential. She looks forward to commencing the work of the PVC-I (Academic) in all its complexities and challenges. Professor Barrett is of Dhanggati heritage from the Macleay River region in northern NSW and has worked in various roles in the University of Sydney since 2000, becoming Professor of Museum and Heritage Studies in January 2020. She will hold both the role of Director of the NCCC and the PVC-I role. 10
